GRINNELL COLLEGE. The Department of Chemistry invites applications for a tenure-track appointment in chemistry beginning Fall 2017. Assistant Professor (Ph.D.) preferred; Associate Professor possible. The teaching responsibilities will be in inorganic chemistry with involvement in introductory chemistry; a demonstrated interest in participation in the College's general education offerings is also expected. In addition, the candidate is expected to develop an active research program involving undergraduates.

In letters of application, candidates should discuss their potential to contribute to a college community that maintains a diversity of people and perspectives as one of its core values.
